Nick Owen was one of the first faces on Breakfast TV in this country, actually presenting the sport on the very first day of TV-AM in 1983. Within eight weeks, he had replaced David Frost as the main anchorman and was soon joined by Anne Diamond. That was the start of a partnership that included Good Morning with Anne and Nick a decade later for BBC 1. As a couple, they hosted at least a thousand programmes together.

Nick was also ITV Sport's main presenter for six years, taking over from Brian Moore in 1986. Apart from the regular weekly show, Midweek Sport Special, he also anchored the Olympics of 1988 and the World Cup of 1990. He's hosted three game shows, reported for the old travel programme Wish You Were Here and presented all the royal film premier programmes on ITV from 1986 to 1992, when he had considerable involvement with Princess Diana.

He's been fortunate enough to have interviewed scores of high profile figures from all walks of life, including six Prime Ministers, going back to Harold Wilson, plus Eric Morecambe, Bob Hope in his garden in Los Angeles and Pierce Brosnan at his Malibu home.

Nick received the Baird Medal from the Royal Television Society for services to television and, in 2010, he was named Speaker of the Year by the National Association of Speakers Clubs. He has spoken at hundreds of dinners and also on a number of cruise ships.

Apart from his broadcasting life, Nick is also chairman of Luton Town Football Club and a past President of Derbyshire County Cricket Club. He was made an honorary Doctor of Letters by the University of Worcester in 2013 for services to broadcasting and the community.
